"Priests and Kings"



PRIESTS AND KINGS — SESSION 2 KEY POINTS:

- Yahweh's people are all called to serve Him as priests and kings.
- Our priestly role is one of leading in worship, teaching the Covenant (*Torah*), and of intercession.
- Our kingly role involves working to restore the full dominion of *Yahweh* to fallen Earth. This is a role of spiritual warfare, *Torah* obedience, and keeping all within our realm of authority in subjection to *Yahweh*.
- Our aim and life-prayer is all that *Yahshua* demonstrated in the Lord's Prayer.
- The work of leadership under *Yahweh's* supreme Authority is a great blessing, which serves to aid in bringing about the part of the prayer: "Thy Kingdom come. Thy Will be done in earth as it is in Heaven."
- Righteous, Heaven-appointed leaders are biblically categorized as godly *elohim*.
- False gods are in rebellion against **Yahweh**.



Key Scriptures: Rev. 5:10, Exodus 19:6, Rev. 22:3-5

And hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth." Revelation 5:10

"And ye shall be unto Me a kingdom of priests, and an holy nation. These are the words which thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel." $_{\rm Exodus~19:6}$

"And there shall be no more curse: but <u>the Throne of God</u> and of the Lamb shall be in it; and His servants shall serve <u>Him</u>: And they shall see His Face; and His Name shall be in their foreheads. And there shall be no night there... and <u>they shall reign for ever and ever</u>."

Good vs. Evil Elohim...

As we studied in session 1 of the *Priests and Kings Workshop*, the word, "**God**" is translated from the Hebrew word "*Elohim*". *Elohim* is a plural word, which is a title, applying to anyone in appointed to:

Understanding that the word translated as "god" in the KJV was actually "*elohim*", which can apply to anyone in leadership, helps us with a very hard Scripture. If it is wrong (*idolatrous*) for a human or an angel to be an *elohim*, we quickly run up against a Scriptural problem...
In Exodus 4:16, *Yahweh* appointed Moses to be an *elohim*.

Read Exodus 4:16, taking note of the words which were wrongly added by Bible translators. Removing these added words, what does the verse actually say?

What does it mean?

"And he (*Aaron*) shall be thy (*Moses*') spokesman unto the people: and he shall be, even he shall be to thee instead of a mouth, and thou shalt be to him instead of god (*elohim*)." Exodus 4:16



Elohim (god) is Strong's Concordance number H430. In Scripture, who is righteously called an elohim, starting with Yahweh? Yahweh is called God (Elohim) with a capital E. Why is He called Elohim?	In the First Commandment, <i>Yahweh</i> doesn't say to disregard all <i>elohim</i> other than Himself. After all, He has appointed others as <i>elohim</i> . And disrespect of and/or rejection of <i>Yahweh</i> appointed leadership is rebellion (<i>Exodus</i> 22:28). In Exodus 20:1-3, what does He say?

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
Both the priesthood and kingship are positions of Heaven-appointed leadership. What responsibilities are involved in performing these two positions of leadership, in Scripture?



Discussion Scriptures:

Thou shalt in any wise set him king over thee, whom Yahweh thy God shall choose: one from among thy brethren shalt thou set king over thee: thou mayest not set a stranger over thee, which is not thy brother. But he shall not multiply horses to himself, nor cause the people to return to Egypt... Neither shall he multiply wives to himself, that his heart turn not away: neither shall he greatly multiply to himself silver and gold. And it shall be, when he sitteth upon the throne of his kingdom, that he shall write him a copy of this Law in a book out of that which is before the priests the Levites: And it shall be with him, and he shall read therein all the days of his life: that he may learn to fear Yahweh his God, to keep all the words of this Law and these Statutes, to do them: That his heart be not lifted up above his brethren, and that he turn not aside from the commandment, to the right hand, or to the left: to the end that he may prolong his days in his kingdom, he, and his children, in the midst of Israel."
